

# WHOM DO YOU CHOOSE TO SAVE SOMEONE FROM SOMETHING?

**POLITICKING** today is like preaching was in David Zeisberger's lifetime. If five words summarize their salespitch sermonizing, they are: *To save someone from something*.

Zeisberger, a Moravian minister, lived from 1721-1805. He became a missionary after his ordination in 1749 and spent decades among Indian tribes he called "My Brown Brethren." How many Indians he "saved" through conversion to Christianity is unclear; however, he lived among those whom he convinced to exchange scalping for sowing seeds. Betrayal by Christians was recorded in his diary entries of March 7 and 8, 1782, about the 97 Indians murdered at Gnadenhütten by white militia:

"They prayed and sang until the tomahawks struck into their heads. The boy who was scalped and got away said the blood flowed in streams in the house. They burned the dead bodies together with the houses which they set on fire. . ."

By 1862, when Christian Schussele painted the above picture entitled "The Power of the Gospel," David Zeisberger was famous as "The Apostle of the Indians." Is it possible that the message the artist depicted being delivered by Zeisberger - to sell the natives of Goschgoschünk (Place of the Pig) on conversion - was based on the 34<sup>th</sup> Psalm, which says:

". . . Glorify the Lord with me. Together let us praise his name. I sought the Lord and he answered me; from all my terrors he set me free. The angel of the Lord is encamped around those who revere him, to rescue them. Taste and see that the Lord is good. He is happy who seeks refuge in him."

The moral of this story is to be cautious about those to whom you entrust your faith, as your life could depend on it. That's true whether you're concerned about homelessness, or you *are* homeless in Monterey.

- Pacific Grove: Various media reports on social media as well as radio and TV, plus letters to the editors of several newspapers, all complain about homeless campers now parking their vehicles along the ocean front in Pacific Grove, starting at Lovers Point and going south to Asilomar Beach. Whether they are from the former Roberts Lake Community, also known as the Col. Durham Camp in Seaside, is unknown.
- Seaside: Craig Malin, City Manager of Seaside who was involved in the first homelessness boondoggle busting on the Monterey Peninsula is leaving on August 31. New leadership team members introduced on Aug. 2 at a Town Hall hosted by Seaside City Councilman Dave Pacheco were: Derrick Elder, Support Practitioner; Dominique Davis, City Clerk; Trevin Barber, Assistant to the City Manager: Ashley Collick, Asst. City Manager; Amanda Rotella, Asst. City Manager.

Since Seaside kicked off the homelessness boondoggle busting and Governor Gavin Newsom picked it up and ran with it, the question arises about what will happen if he is recalled.

*Newsweek* carried a major feature by Meghan Roos about Gov. Gavin Newsom on Aug. 10, 2021. In it, Orrin Heatlie, lead proponent of the Recall Gavin Newsom campaign, said it is "kind of surprising" to him that Newsom's team would advise voters against filling out the second portion of the ballot... Heatlie said he wants voters to support Newsom's removal from office.

But for those who intend to SUPPORT Newsom and vote "NO" on the first question on the recall ballot, he said, they should explore all the qualifying recall candidates and pick the one they'd most like to see in office. Visualize the painting in which David Zeisberger is preaching to the Indians, but imagine a current political figure in his place. He is not addressing Native Americans. He is surrounded by a local encampment of homeless people to whom he is selling Project Homekey as housing for the homeless.

To fulfill his promise, he must win the 2021 Recall Governor Newsom election on Sept. 14, 2021.
